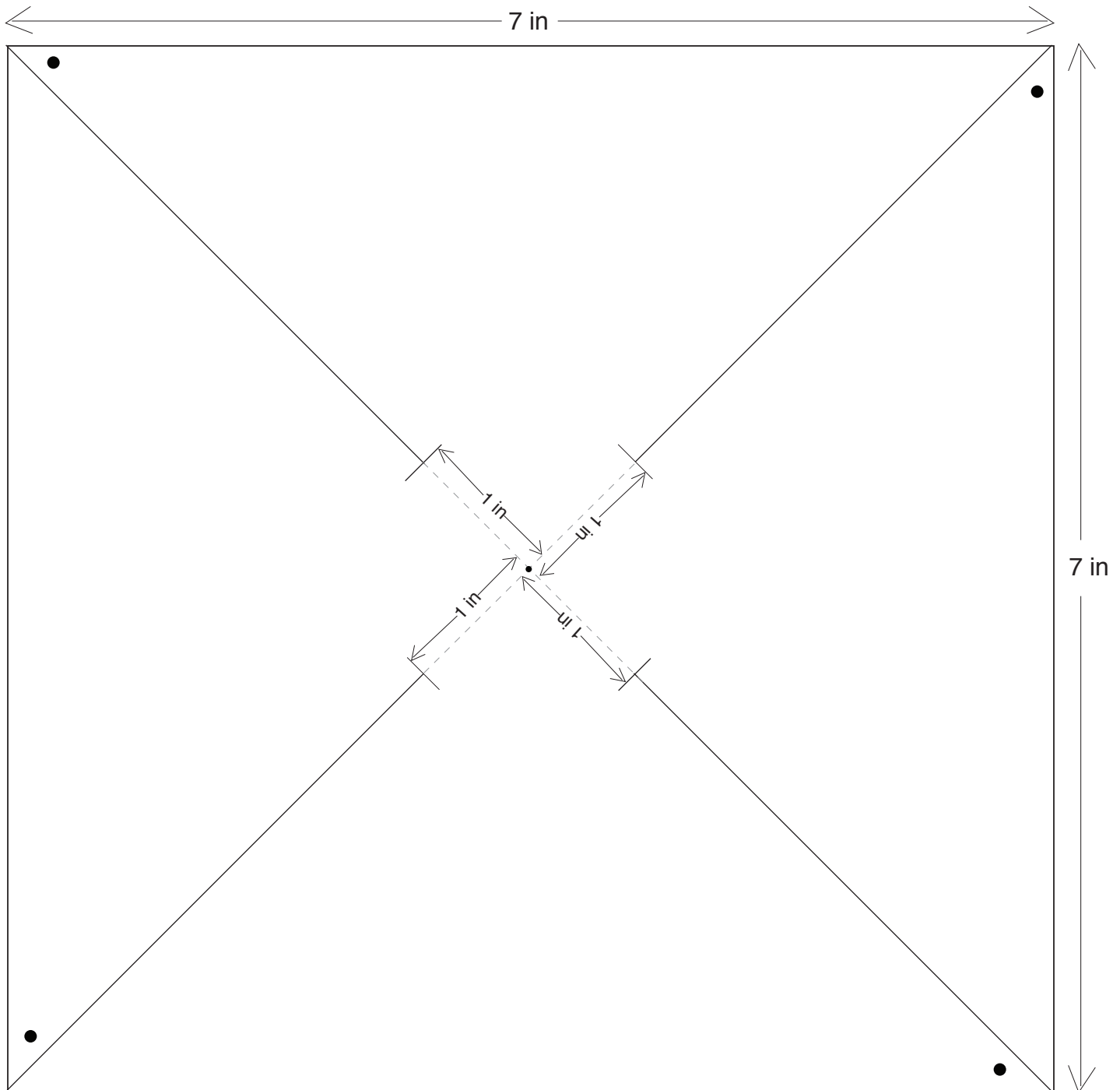


Pinwheel Template



Supplies

(2) Sheets decorative paper,  
at least 8in x 8in

(1) 1/4in Dowel rod, 1ft long,  
painted or plain

Spray glue

Heavy duty push pins  
or upholstery tacks

Key

————— cut

● fold this corner to center

Spray-mount two pieces of decorative paper back to back, and allow to dry. Cut out a 7in square. Decide which pattern you want as the interior of your pinwheel, and lay your paper with that side facing up. Find the center of your square by lightly drawing diagonal lines from corner to corner with a pencil. Measure 1 inch out from the center in each direction and mark. Cut a straight line from each of the corners to the corresponding 1 inch mark, as shown on the template. Lightly erase all pencil lines except your center mark. Your square should now have 8 corner points. Bring every other point toward the center, allowing the points to overlap slightly where they meet in the middle. Push a pin or decorative upholstery tack through all 4 center points to secure them. Push the pin firmly into the dowel about 1/2 inch from the top, and you're done! Make more pinwheels and display together in a vase, or stick them into the ground on a sunny day for outdoor party decoration.
